I hope you are all keeping well. We have had a very busy few weeks with no signs of slowing down in the next few weeks ahead! Please see below some points of information to note:

Coole Park Outing:

Thursday 6th March is World Book Day:

Children can bring in their favourite book to discuss with their class and dress up as their **favourite book character** to celebrate this day. We will do a parade after lunch to show off our costumes! Pupils will receive a Book Token to the value of €1.50 and will be valid until 23rd March.
